## I. Introduction:

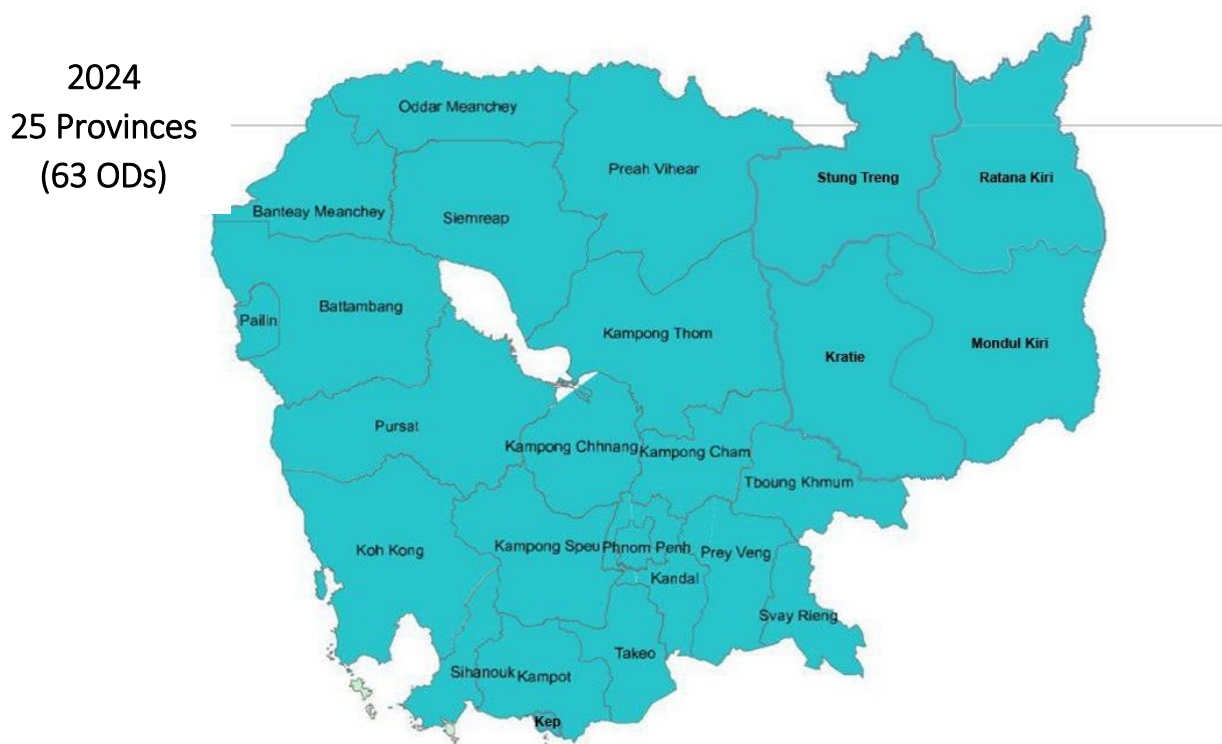
Boosted Integrated Active Case Management, (B-IACM) has been a cornerstone strategy for the national HIV program. With the objective of B-IACM to leverage existing strategies and approaches for case detection, immediate ART enrolment and retention in HIV care to achieve the global 95-95-95 targets by 2025.

B-IACM was initiated in 2014 in Siem Reap and Battambang provinces and scaled up to 25 provinces (60 operational districts) by June, 2022.

The Group of Champion (GoC), has play very important role in coordinating and networking for implementation of Boosted Integrated Active Case Management. (B-IACM) As the member of GoC, the Case Management Coordinator (CMC) and Case Management Assistant (CMA), have actively work in routine for collecting data and record in database.

## II. B-IACM Coverage.

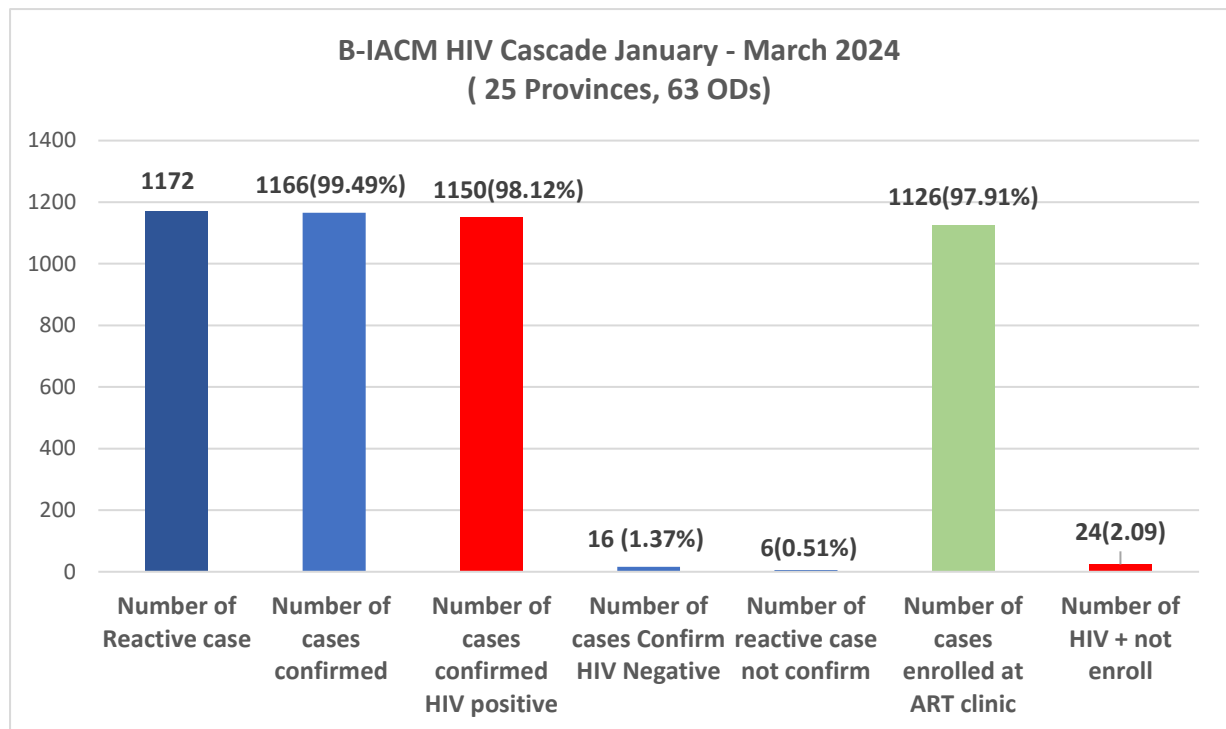
The B-IACM coverage is in 25 provinces (63 ODs)



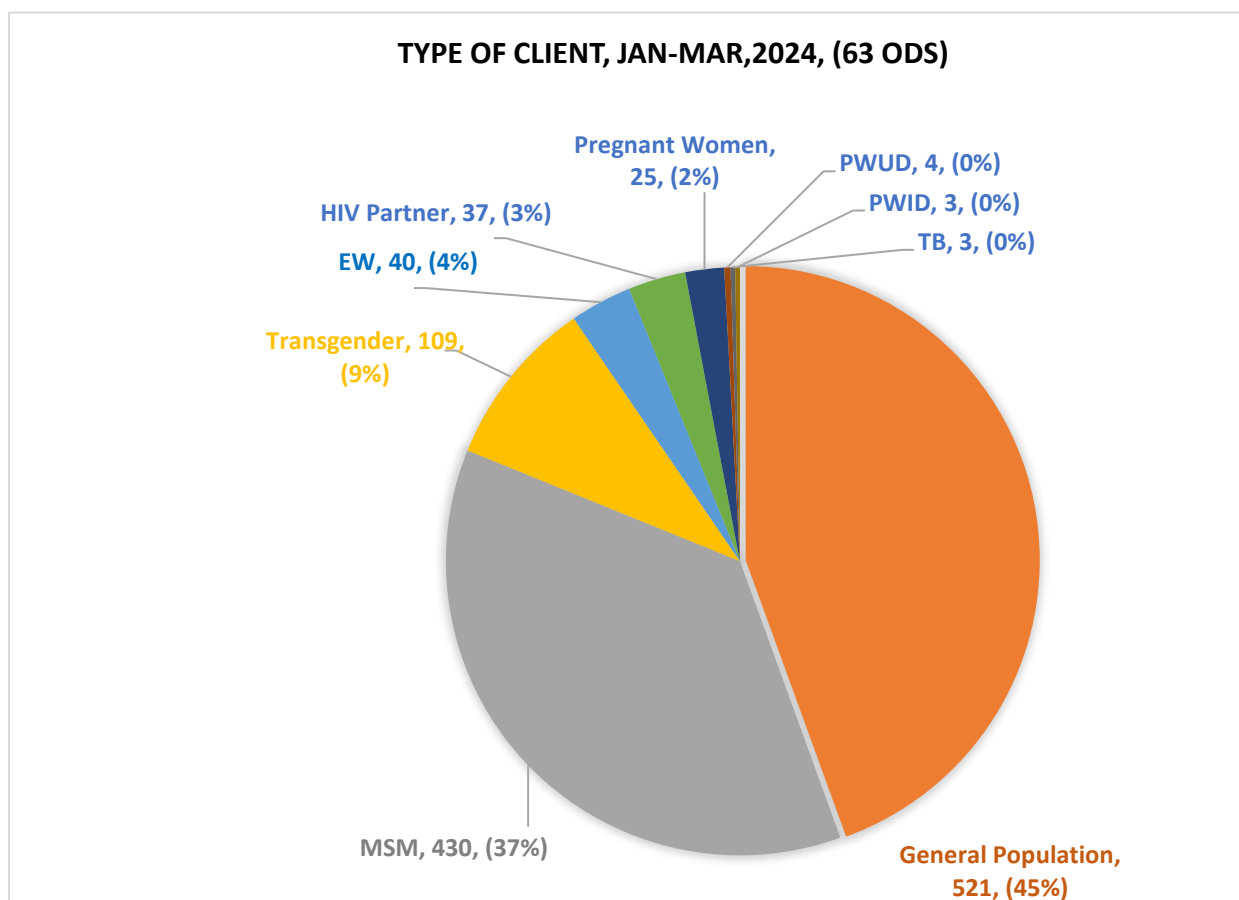
## III. Program Achievement.

The B-IACM HIV cascade of quarter 1 from January to March, 2024. Based on data sent by CMCs, (Case Management Coordinator) and CMAs, (Case Management Assistant) from 25 provinces (63 ODs), There were **1,172** of new HIV cases detected (new reactive cases). With among those reactive cases **1,172**, there were **1,166 (99.49%)** cases have come for the

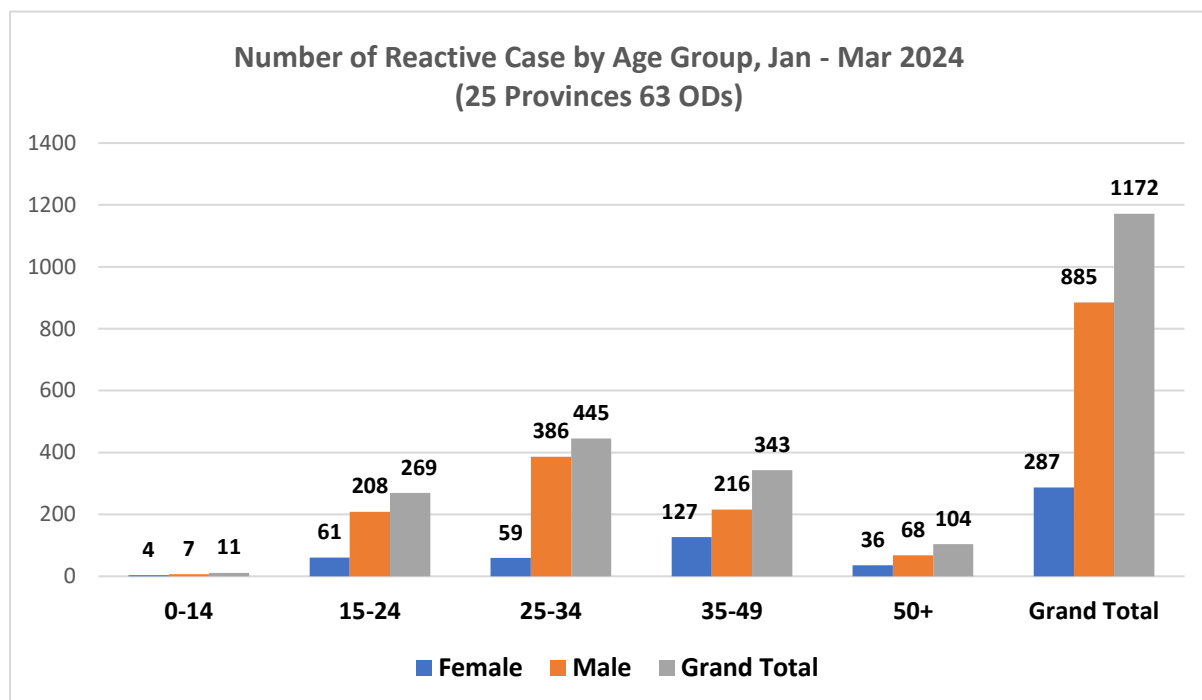
confirmatory test at VCCT with positive result were 1,150 (98.12%) and those 1,126 (97.91%) cases have been enrolled at ART services.



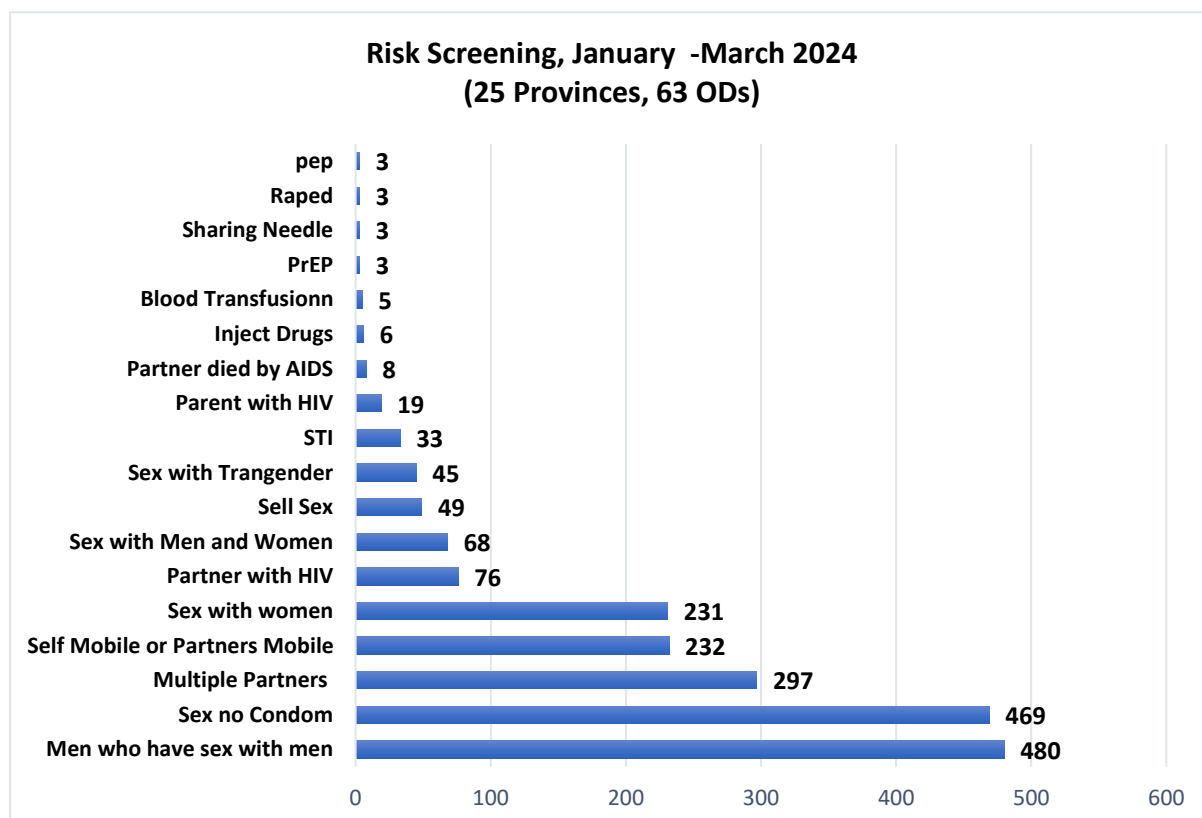
The chart below is the Reactive Cases classified by Client Type. The among of 1,172 with a reactive result, of 45% (N=521) were general population , followed by MSM is 37% (N= 430), TG: 9% (N= 109), Entertainment Worker: 4% (N= 40), HIV partners: 3% (N=37), Pregnant Woman: 2% (N= 25), PWUP: 0% (N= 4) ,PWID 0% (N=3), TB patient: 0% (N= 3) ,



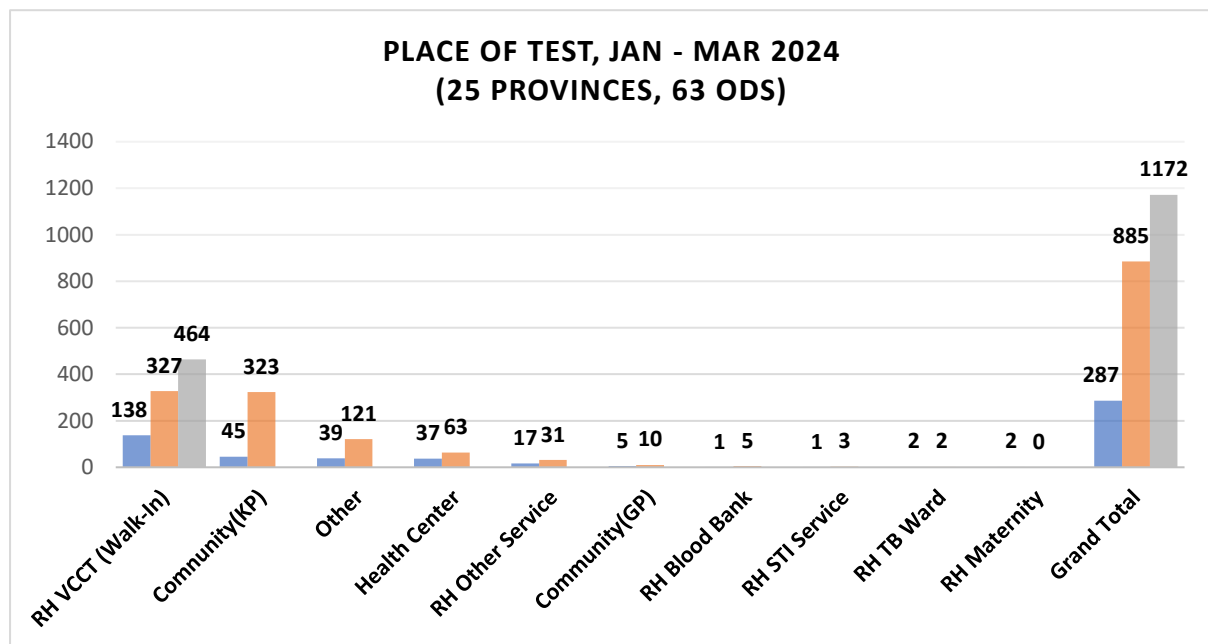
The chart below shows the number of HIV Reactive Case classified by age group , from less than <15, and 15-24, 25-34, 35-49 and 50 plus. Data from January– March 2024 in 25 provinces. (63 ODs). Among the age group, the high risk age group was between 25 to 34.



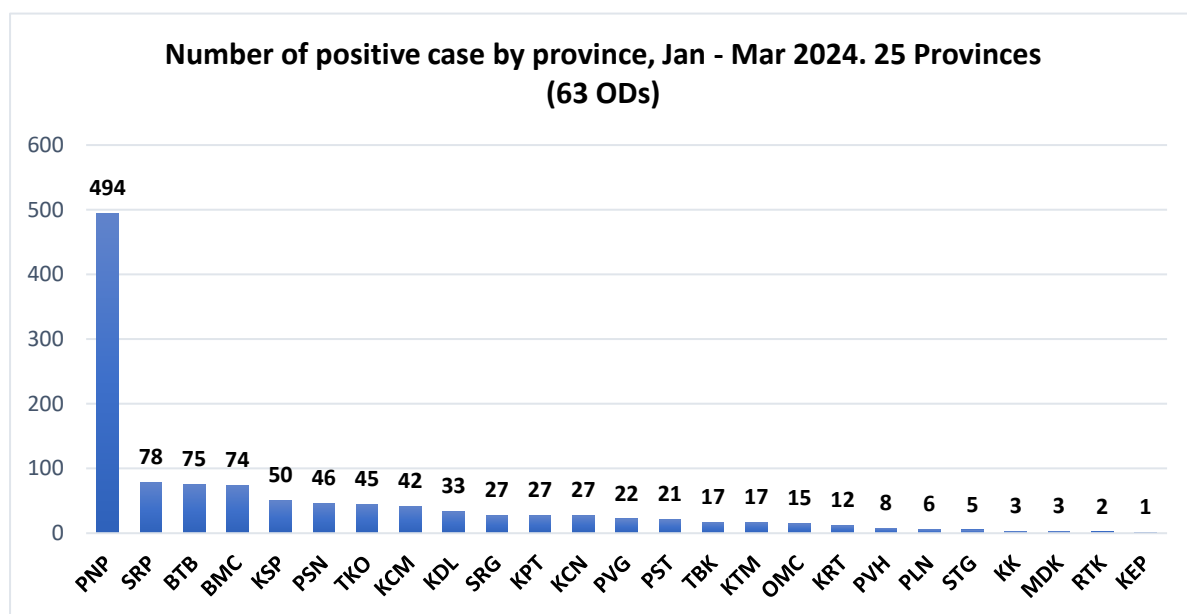
With Among the Risk Screening of reactive group, we found that clients have experienced at risk behavior were Men who have sex with Men (MSM), followed by people who have sex not using condom, Partners has multiple partners, Having sex with womem, Partners with HIV, and those who having sex with man and women, Sex with Men and Women and STIs, were among the top risks behaviour with putting them to HIV infection.



The chart below shows the place where the clients come for testing HIV. The Data from January– March 2024 in 25 provinces. (63 ODs).



The chart shows the number of HIV positive cases by province of among the 25 provinces,(63 ODs) from January to March 2024. Phnom Penh is the highest number of HIV positive cases, followed by Siem Reap, Battambang, Banteay Meanchey, Kampong Speu, Sihanouk Ville, and Takeo, ..etc. Ratanakiri has 2 cases and Kep has only 1 HIV positive case in this quarter.



### Trainings/Meeting:

In this quarter, With Capacity building and sharing the progression of implementation of Boosted Integrated Active Management and reflect to the challenges and solution of B-IACM Implementation and moving forward in 25 provinces with 63 Operational Health District.

- 25-26 January 2024: “ Training on B-IACM Implemenation and database to scaling up new site for CMC and CMA” : From 9 Provinces, Phnom Penh, Banteay Meanchey, Kampong Spue, Kampong Thom, Kampong Chhnang, Pursat, Svay Rieng, Tbong Khmum and Kampong Cham. Covered with 13 ODs, Participants: Chief of Provincial HIV/AIDS and STDs Program, PASP, Case Management Coordinator, CMC and Case Coordinator Assistant, CMA. NGO: EpiC FHI 360 and AHF. Total 50 participations

- 27-28 February 2024. PHD Kampong Chhnang Province . Training on HIV Recency Surveillance Data use and Public Health Responses - To review current Cambodia HIV epidemic and interventions, share recency surveillance updates (WHO and PEPFAR guidance, Cambodia PHR guidance notes) and provide clear orientation on how to use recency data surveillance for PHR. From 10 Provinces: Phnom Penh, Battambang, Banteay Meanchey, Siem Reap, Takeo, Preah Sihanouk, Kampot, Kampong Cham, Prey Veng and Kandal. Participants: PASP, PDMO, VCCT, ART Team, PC and NGOs: CDC, FHI 360, CRS, KHANA, RHAC, AHF. Total 70 Participations.

- 15 03, 2024. OD Prey Kabas, Takeo Province. Conducted “GoC Coordination Meeting for health care providers, NGOs, and relevant stakeholders” to ensure the whole cascade from case finding to connecting and receiving quality of HIV related services effectively. HIV-infected cases to reach the first 95 by 2025. Participants from PHD, OD Preykabas, OD Kirivong, OD Angroka, Takeo RH, OD Kos Andeth, OD Daunkeo, OD Bati, NGO: PASP, CMC, CMA, ART Team leader, VCCT Chief, OD Coordinator HIV and NGO partners: PC and MHC. Total 29 participants.

- 18 03, 2024. PHD Kampong Cham Province. Conducted “GoC Coordination Meeting for health care providers, NGOs, and relevant stakeholders” to ensure the whole cascade from case finding to PASP, PDMO, CMC, CMA, ART Team Leader, Counselor, NGO, NCHADS connecting and receiving quality of HIV related services effectively. HIV-infected cases to reach the first 95 by 2025. Participants from PHD, Kampong Cham, OD KPC-KPS, OD Chamkaluer, OD Srey Santhor, OD Batheay, OD Chueng Prey and NGOs: PASP, PDMO, CMC, CMA, ART Team Leader, Counselor, NGO, MHC and NCHADS, Total 33 Participants.

#### IV. Challenges.

Although all activities have been implemented and achieved in this quarter, some issues have hampered the implementation of this strategy, including

- GFATM grant for 2024-2026 did not approved for OD GoC Coordinaton Meeting which this impact for implementation B-IACM activities especially GoC meeting at ODs and provincial level for effectively coordinating and monitoring on B-IACM Implementation.

#### Next Plan.

The B-IACM Team will be ongoing to provide technical support in the following:

- Provide technical support and coordination work with Group of Champion (GoC) for effectively coordinating on B-IACM Implementation and Monitoring and Coaching for ACM & CQI Interlink.
- Ongoing provide technical support to selected ODs especially new sites and sites with low performance.
- Conduct the Refresher training on B-IACM database and tool.
